It was not publically performed until 1963, not published until 1968 and not recorded until 1974. The version used here is a recording made of the Ciompi Quartet to be used for rehearsals of the dance's 1976 premiere, which featured the Quartet's live accompaniment.

The Synergic Theater ...

Founded as an interdisciplinary collaboration at Duke University in 1974, the Synergic Theater went on to present original theatrical productions and creative process workshops under the direction of Suzanne White Manning and David Manning (1976) through 1994. From inception, this work explored and applied fresh possibilities and sensibilities in the use of sound, image and movement media as artistic resources. The results, in both workshops and productions, represented ineffable, self-defining experiences. Each manifestation tended to be ephemeral in its existence with a perpetually renewing underlying nature. see synergictheater.org
